## **Kitten Season is Here: Henderson Cats Takes Action to Control the Outdoor Cat Population**

**HENDERSON, NV (March 6, 2025)** — As spring approaches, so does “Kitten Season,” the time of year when unspayed female cats give birth, leading to a surge in the outdoor cat population. This annual increase results in overcrowded animal shelters, higher euthanasia rates, and more unowned cats struggling to survive. To address this growing issue, Henderson Cats is actively working to implement humane solutions through its Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) program.

TNVR is a proven and effective method of population control that involves humanely trapping community cats, spaying or neutering them, vaccinating them, and then returning them to their outdoor homes. This prevents endless cycles of breeding while ensuring the cats remain healthy and stable in their environments. Unlike traditional removal methods, which have been shown to be ineffective in the long run, TNVR is a sustainable approach that reduces the number of kittens born each year, ultimately easing the burden on local shelters and improving the lives of community cats.

“The number of kittens born during this season can be overwhelming,” said Arvie Bromley, Founder at Henderson Cats. “One unspayed female cat can have more than three litters per year, with an average of five kittens per litter. Without intervention, those kittens grow up, reproduce, and the cycle continues. Through our TNVR program, we are actively breaking this cycle and making a real impact on our local cat population.”

The benefits of TNVR go beyond just population control. Sterilized cats are less likely to exhibit nuisance behaviors such as yowling, spraying, and fighting. Vaccinations also help protect both the cats and the community from diseases. Additionally, fewer cats in shelters mean more resources can be allocated to adoptable pets, reducing euthanasia rates and improving overall animal welfare.
